

Deadline 1st May

Eligibility

- Applicants must be **tenured** academic staff
- Strictly to support new academic staff (<10yrs from PhD with <£100K funding) and/or established academic staff with no current research funding.
- Applicants must have been a full member of the BSN for at least 6 months.
- **Non-UK based BSN members are eligible to apply.** See website for details on how to join the BSN <http://www.neuroendo.org.uk/>
- A candidate may only receive one such award and if this is an early/mid-career researcher, it will be awarded as a named prize.
- Two awards per year will be made up to the value of £10,000 each (typically ~£7500 each).
- Awardees are required to publish in the Journal of Neuroendocrinology and prize awards will be presented at the annual BSN meeting.
- Applicants who have had active participation in the BSN or previously published in the Journal of Neuroendocrinology will be looked on favourably.

Summary

- Strictly to provide support for consumables/other research costs to enable research in the area of neuroendocrinology
- The scheme can benefit BSN members who are in the early stages of their independent career, or those who have limited grant income, in providing leverage for them to complete pilot experiments necessary for major external grant applications.
- Awards will be up to a maximum of £10000 for identified consumables/research costs. Up to 2 awards will be made available per year.
- Published work resulting from Academic Support Funding should clearly acknowledge the BSN funding.
- 1 deadline per year **1st May.**

Application form and deadlines

- Full justification for the grant is required.
- Deadlines for application will be 1st May each year.
- Applications must be made in advance and late or retrospective applications will not be considered.
