Project Support Grant Guidelines

Eligibility

- All BSN members are eligible to apply, either on their own behalf or on behalf of a student.
- Students nominated for project support by academic staff must become BSN members before the project commences.
- Applicants who have previously received funding from the BSN may apply again. However, all applications will be assessed in open competition, and further funding is not guaranteed. Previous awardees must demonstrate that any earlier grant was used productively.
- Applicants who were unsuccessful in previous rounds are encouraged to reapply.
- Applicants must have been members of the British Society for Neuroendocrinology (BSN) for at least six months at the time of application. Join today: www.neuroendo.org.uk/join.
- Applicants must have submitted a [Grant Report Form](#) for any previous BSN grants received.
- Membership subscriptions must be fully paid at the date of application.

Summary

Project Support Grants may be used to cover reasonable research-related costs, including (but not limited to) salaries, consumables, and other research expenses. All requested costs must be fully justified.

Where funding is requested for salary support, applicants must provide a letter from their institution confirming that, if the application is successful, the BSN will not assume any contractual liability for the researcher.

Any publications, presentations, or other outputs arising from the funded project must acknowledge BSN support and include the grant number where appropriate.

Awards will be made up to a maximum value of £8,000.

How to apply

Applications must be submitted via the BSN [Membership Portal](#). Applicants should log in and navigate to: Me and the BSN > Grants.

Deadlines

Applicants should refer to the BSN [website](#) for current application deadlines.

Applications must be submitted before the relevant deadline. Late or retrospective applications will not be considered.

Assessment Panel

Applications will be assessed by a Grants Subcommittee convened by the Grants Secretary or Deputy Grants Secretary.

Award criteria

In the event that there are more fundable applications than awards available, preference may be given to applicants who:

- Have not received a BSN award within the previous two years (excluding BSN International Travel Grants and Early Career Researcher Travel Grants).
- Have made an active contribution to a BSN meeting, for example through an oral presentation, poster presentation, workshop, or session chairing role.
- Have published in the Journal of Neuroendocrinology.

The decision of the Grants Subcommittee is final, and no correspondence will be entered into regarding award decisions.

Grant Report Form

All successful applicants are required to submit a [Grant Report Form](#) no later than six months after the end of the grant period.

Please note that future BSN grants will not be awarded to applicants who have failed to submit a Grant Report Form for a previous award.

These awards are made possible through income generated by the Society-owned Journal of Neuroendocrinology. The BSN is grateful to members who choose to publish in the journal and thereby support future grants and awards.
